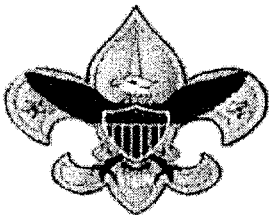

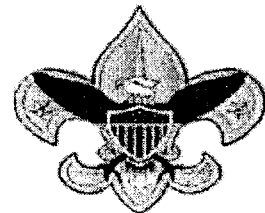

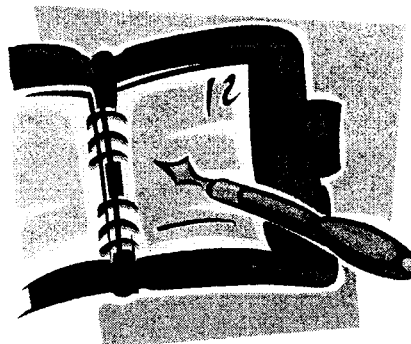

OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS TRAINING FOR BOY SCOUT AND WEBELOS LEADERS FOR 2009-2010

The Outdoor Leader Skills course teaches the outdoor leader skills needed in order to help a Scout reach the rank advancement. This is a required course for adult leaders registered as Scoutmasters/Asst Scoutmasters and Webelos/Asst Webelos Den Leaders in order for them to earn the trained patch in their registered position. Attendance at this course is recommended for all Scout Leaders, not only those who plan to attend a Wood Badge course, but also for those who work with their unit's youth in their outdoors program. Only those registered as Scoutmasters/Asst Scoutmasters and Webelos/Asst Webelos Den Leaders may earn the trained patch by attending.

BOY SCOUT LEADER SPECIFIC TRAINING includes the following **Leader Specific Training** (8 hours- including 1 hour lunch break):

- Scoutmaster
- Assistant Scoutmaster
- Troop Committee

A Troop Leader is considered trained upon completion of "THIS IS SCOUTING", Boy Scout Leader Specific, Youth Protection Training, Boy Scout Fast Start, and Intro to Outdoor Leader Skills.

CUB SCOUT LEADER SPECIFIC TRAINING includes **Introduction to Cub Scouting** (45 min), **How We Have Fun** (45 min), and the following **Leader Specific Training** (1 1/2 hour):

- Tiger Cub Den Leader
- Cub Scout Den Leaders
- Webelos Den Leaders
- Cubmasters
- Pack Committee Chairs and Committee Members

A Pack leader is considered trained upon completion of "THIS IS SCOUTING", Cub Scout Leader Specific, Cub Scout Fast Start, and Youth Protection Training.

VENTURING LEADER SPECIFIC TRAINING includes **Leader Specific Training** (4 hours) for Crew Advisors.

A Crew Leader is considered trained upon completion of "THIS IS SCOUTING", Venturing Leader Specific, Youth Protection Training, and Venturing Fast Start.

WILDERNESS FIRST AID BASICS
November 6th – 7th, 2009
Sponsored by
ALAMO AREA COUNCIL, B.S.A.

Location: Scout Service Center, San Antonio, Texas.

SCHEDULE: Check-in starts at 5:00 p.m. Friday, November 6th in the Conference Room. Class begins promptly at 6 p.m. and will run late Friday night. We continue promptly at 8:00 a.m. Saturday morning with a break for lunch at noon and a break for dinner at 5:30 p.m. then continues until 9:00 p.m.

DESCRIPTION: The Transylvania County Chapter of the American Red Cross (ARC) developed the 16 hour Wilderness First Aid Basics to meet the needs of people in situations where emergency response is over 30 minutes. This course combines class lecture, skills practice, and realistic scenarios to teach assessment, basic and advanced first aid techniques, extended care, transports and evacuations, and dealing with emotional ally upset patients. Basic first aid skills are covered making this course appropriate for anyone regardless of experience level. Those who successfully complete this class (including passing a written test) will receive the ARC "Wilderness First Aid Basics" card which is valid for 3 years. The class has no prerequisites, however, current First Aid and CPR skills will be helpful. While preliminary victim recognition and assessment skills will be discussed, CPR skills will NOT be taught during the course. A minimum age of 15 is recommended for participants due to the serious nature of the course and scenarios.

WHAT TO BRING: Participants should bring some basic camping equipment including sleeping bag or blanket and ground pad; clothing appropriate for work outside in spring (incl. Rain gear); water bottles, pencil and notepad.

FEE: Registration and fee of \$100.00 must be received at Council office by 5:00 p.m. October 30th. Includes meals and materials. Please register early to avoid disappointment! **SPACE IS LIMITED TO 15 PEOPLE**. The roster is first come, first served. You are not on the list until your payment and form are accepted at the Scout Office. Units will be responsible for two deep leadership.

Cost: There is no charge, and advance registration is not required.

This training is required of all adult leaders working with youth in the Pack, Troop, or Crew. If you plan on going with your Pack to Cub Scout Day camp or with your Troop to Summer camp, then you must take the on-line Youth Protection Course and earn your trained card from it in order to attend with your unit. This last requirement is dictated by State law and must be redone annually if you go to Day Camp or Summer Camp.
